Reflections...

Dear Parishioners,

The June apparition concluded in the same manner as the first one in May, with Our Lady departing towards the east, from which she had come, and disappearing into the “immensity of heaven.” The upper leaves of the little holm oak tree remained for several hours stretched and bent towards the east. The pattern of the communication of Our Lady with the children remained the same as before: she conversed with Lucia, who could both see her and hear her. St. Jacinta could see her and hear her. St. Francisco could only see her and could not hear her.

The 50 or so persons present at the June apparition were a consolation to the three children. The onlookers knew something special had happened. None of them saw Our Lady, but Maria Carreira reported hearing a faint sound, “like the buzzing of a bee,” from the top of the tree when Lucia reported that Our Lady was speaking to her. Others noticed the brief dimming of the sun’s light and the bending of the branches and leaves of the tree. Other saw the “lightning” and a little gray cloud that came and went as the apparition did.

Despite these gifts of consolation, the children were faced with a great deal of suffering from the incredulity of those closest to them. Their mothers especially were alarmed by the apparitions, as the intensity of the situation was now increasing. Their parish priest, Fr. Manuel Ferreira, suspected that the apparitions might be real but of demonic origin. On June 14, he closely questioned the children and concluded that they were not lying about the apparitions. When he suggested that they might be from the devil, the children indignantly rejected the idea. In the end, the careful priest could not make up his mind about the origin of the apparitions, even as he concluded that the children were telling the truth.

The doubt of Fr. Ferreira would become a month-long spiritual and emotional trial for Lucia, who greatly respected the authority of her pastor. Her heart would be eased at the next month’s apparition, in which Our Lady would reveal to her a great secret. *“In my second account I have already described in detail the doubt which tormented me from 13 June until 13 July,”* Lucia wrote, *“and how it disappeared completely during the Apparition on that day.”*

On June 26, 1917, Archbishop Pacelli presented his credentials as new papal ambassador to Chancellor Bethmann-Hollweg in Berlin. In his meeting a few days later with the German Kaiser Wilhelm, he presented a personal letter to the Kaiser from Pope Benedict XV, pleading for a greater effort for peace. The Kaiser responded with irrational outbursts of anger towards the Holy Father. The grim truth was that Wilhelm was no longer really running Germany, nor was Bethmann-Hollweg. General Erich Ludendorff, who would become the main supporter of Adolf Hitler’s rise to power in Munich, was two weeks away from being the effective ruler of Germany. The only cool head involved in the war was that of Blessed Charles II, the Holy Roman Emperor. His own peace negotiations with Germany and France (through his wife’s brothers) were precarious at best and would later fail. It was becoming quite clear that the only solution to the Great War would be obedience to the message of Our Lady in Fatima. She had said in May, **“Say the Rosary every day to obtain peace for the world, and the end of the war.”**

July 13, 1917, was the day of Our Lady’s third apparition in Fatima. Lucia, suffering her internal doubts, was under great pressure from her mother and almost did not go to meet Our Lady. She had confided her doubts to St. Jacinta, who, filled with holy simplicity and supported by her devout father and brother, convinced her at the last minute to be faithful to Our Lady. On the morning of July 13, Lucia was filled with great peace and kept her midday appointment joyfully. When the three children arrived at the Cova da Iria, they found at least two thousand people waiting there, including their own parents. Their mothers were deeply distraught over all the commotion. Together the large crowd recited the Holy Rosary. Manuel Marto, the father of Francisco and Jacinta, was already deeply convinced of the truth of the apparitions and he was present to protect the children. He never took his eyes off them the entire time. He reported seeing Lucia go pale immediately before she cried out that Our Lady was coming. Then he saw “something like a small cloud” come down upon the small holm oak tree. He felt a cool and refreshing breeze in the mid-July heat and he heard a sound which he described as a “like a horse-fly in an empty water pot.” Then Our Lady revealed to the children what would become the most controversial part of the Message of Peace given in Fatima.

Diocesan Catholic Speaker Series Starts 17th Year

A long-term ministry of the Oakland diocese, **Catholics@Work**, will begin on Sept. 12 with a speaker who regained control of her life after a very difficult start and now operates a ministry for homeless parents and their children.

Jess Echeverry, who was homeless herself, will tell the story of her climb from the depths that led her to serve people most in need. Echeverry was pregnant at 16, homeless & living on the streets.

Eventually she regained control of her life, became a Catholic & married. Her husband recently was ordained a permanent deacon and now helps homeless families, bringing them food, shoes, plus special help for the children.

Programs, on the 2nd Tuesday, are open to all. **They begin with Mass at 6:30 am, followed by breakfast and the speaker from 7 to 8:15 am, at Crow Canyon Country Club in Danville.**

Including a generous breakfast, the cost is **\$20 for members, \$30 for non-members.**
